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### **COLOPHON & BACKGROUND**

This roadmap is the result of a collaboration between the <u>Civic Interaction Design Lectorate at the Amsterdam University of Applied Sciences</u>, <u>PubHubs</u>, <u>Public Spaces</u>, the City of Amsterdam and the Universities of <u>Nijmegen</u> and <u>Utrecht</u> on the development of a UX design and Use Cases for PubHubs. This research was made possible by a financial contribution from the <u>SIDN Fund</u>. Public Spaces took the lead in developing the Roadmap.

The themes in this roadmap emerged from desk research into recent developments in the field of social media and the broader <u>design research trajectory</u> of the AUAS into the User Experience and Use Cases for PubHubs. The focus was on the design of what we have come to call Civic Social Media, and that design angle has also colored this roadmap. Specifically for this roadmap, two additional workshops were organized in which project partners and representatives of various organizations such as Waag, Ypsilon, Rathenau Institute, KennisCloud and the Ministry of the Interior and Kingdom Relations provided input.
